I will have to close now because I have a lot of work to do on a leather hand-bag which I am making for Isolde and I want to get it finished for her birthday next month, but please don't tell anybody because you know how things go around and I don't want her to find out as I want it to be a surprise. Well good-bye for the present, and I hope I will soon see you again, because a good talk together is always better than a letter.
