Full details and remarks as to service:—

Landed England. December 1916. Training camp Larkhill (Salisbury Plain) to March 1917. Drafted to France to 18<sup>th</sup> Battery. 6.A.7.A.B 5 joined unit near Bapaume in April 1917. From Somme went north to Messines in support of attack June 1917. In July to Neuport on Belgian Coast. In September to Ypres, evacuated ~~there~~ with Trench Fever & rejoined unit near Bailleul in November 1917. In action throughout winter in neighbourhood of Ypres & Messines. In April 1918 to the Somme, in action in various parts of this area until August 8<sup>th</sup> 1918, when supported the advance from near Villers Bretonneux. Sept. 1918 attack on Hindenburg line near Peronne. Remained in action in support of American infantry until October 25<sup>th</sup> 1918, being last in action at St. Remy, near Cambrai.
