Dear Sir .,-

The following are the particulars asked

for in your memo of 4th instant, of my son :-

No 2,135 *Corporal* Trafford. M. Cosh, 32nd (late 27th) Battalion. A. I. F.,

He was in the evacuation from Gallipoli after spending three (3) months at that place.

He took part in the attack on Pozieres in France, was wounded by the brass base of a grenade having been driven into the upper muscle of the right arm & was sent to Didsbury Hospital, Manchester, where he remained until October 1916, when he was discharged from Hospital & because he has not the use of his hand or fingers he was directed to take light duty with the troops on Salisbury Plain. He is writing with his left hand & is <sup>in</sup> excellent health generally.
