Full details and remarks as to service:—

I began service as Naval Chaplain, in the R.A.N. on board H.M.A.S. Ormonde on 17th Dec. 1912. In July 1913 I joined H.M.A.S. Sydney at Portsmouth on the date of her first commission, later that month the "Sydney" in company with the "Australia" set out for Sydney, via Cape Town, Fremantle, Melbourne, arriving in Oct. 1913 in Sydney. I was on board H.M.A.S. Sydney continuously until June 1917, when my relief was sent. I then was sent on leave.

I thus served as Naval Chaplain from 17th Dec. 1912 to the end of my leave 31st August 1917, as representative of the Methodist Church of Australia.

[From this date until March 1920 I was studying in Oxford University in Theology.]

I was present at the naval action with the German S.M.S. Eudenberg off Cocos Islands on 9th Nov. 1914.
