

## POLICE COURTS.

### JOY RIDER AND THIEF.

Cyril Pinson, 21, labourer, was fined £10, at the Newtown Police Court yesterday, for having used a motor car without the consent of the owner, Francis Charles Arentz. He was fined a further £10 for having stolen various drugs, valued at £8, the property of Horace Layton Spearman. He pleaded guilty to both charges. Constable Barton, of Petersham, said that about 1 a.m. on May 16 he and other police saw Pinson and two other youths in a single-seater motor car in Parramatta-road, Petersham. The car had been reported stolen. When asked who owned the car, Pinson said, "We pinched it, and were going to Queensland looking for work." Pinson, said witness, admitted that he had stolen opium tablets and other drugs from a car in College-street, city, just before Christmas.

### DEAF MUTE FINED.

Described as both deaf and dumb, a presser, Keith Fox, 28, was fined £11/5/, at the Newtown Police Court yesterday, for driving a motor vehicle while under the influence of liquor, and not having a licence, at Dulwich Hill, on May 16. Constable Garvey, of Marrickville, said that he found Fox under the influence of liquor. He interrogated him by writing questions on paper, and was told by Fox that he had had about five drinks, and did not own the car he was driving. Fox, said witness, had been afflicted since he had an attack of meningitis.
