Full details and remarks as to service:—
 Commanded 2nd Field Coy Engineers with rank of Major. Landed Gallipoli 25th April 1915. On Gallipoli till 14th September and again from 17th November till 17th December 1915. Present at battle Lone Pine on 7/8th August & the Evacuation. Commanded Divisional Engineers 1st Australian Division from 17th November 1915 till April 4th 1918 with rank of Lieut. Colonel. Took part in all actions of 1st Aust. Div during this period in Gallipoli & France including Pozieres, Passchendale &c. From April 4th 1918 till July 5th 1918 in Command of Engineers Train, Depot at Buxtehude, Saxony, England. From July 10th to 17th November 1918 held the position of CRE Corps Troop Australian Corps. Operations of Australian Corps on 8th August 1918. November 17th Appointed Chief Engineer, Australian Corps with temporary rank of Colonel. March 7th Relinquished appointment of Chief Engineer Aust. Corps and returned to England. April 12th left England for Australia
