Pharmacy: Staff-Sergeant, A.A.M.C., A.I.F., France.

Enlisting 21st August, 1915, was appointed sergeant and later staff-sergeant in charge Liverpool Camp Dispensary. Joining 9th Australian Field Ambulance on formation in February, 1916, and crossing to France, served as dispenser at Armentières and Messines, where wounded 7th June, 1917.

Died of Wounds, Bailleul, 7th June, 1917, and was buried in Bailleul Military Cemetery.

Early education at Fort St. High School.
