

Left Australia 18 June 1915 - on Pinalo in 12th Light Horse
Arrived in Egypt 26th July - Gallipoli 29th August 1915 - got his
Commission as 2nd Lieut 8th Dec. 1915 - Evacuation Gallipoli 19th Dec 1915
Returned to Egypt - 29th Dec 1915 - & marched Tel-el-Kebir to
Ismailia across desert 28th March 1916, & 30th of March 1916 -
Left Egypt 19 June 1916 - Arrived in France 29th June 1916 - In
Battle of Fromelles 19th & 20th July 1916 - Arrived in Somme Oct 18th
& with 2nd Lt. Fleury, Quebecourt, Les B. until March 1917
in Battle of Souverat 2nd April 1917 - was wounded & sent to hospital
in France, & then to England - Polygon Wood Sept 28th at Westhoek &
Broodseinde Ridge - ^{arrived} Messines Ridge 16th Nov. & Left 16th Dec 1917
Returned 31st Jan 1918 & Left 22nd March - Returned to Somme 26th
^{March} August 1918. killed Bretteville 6th August - Grand Offensive, commences
of the 4th Army 8th of August 1918 - In line Prozat 16th August 1918
to 25th August - Attack on Peronne Sept 1st & 2nd - got slightly
wounded in neck on second day, but returned rejoined Battalion
some night - Withdrawn from Peronne Sep 8th 1918. In Battle
near Abbeville when Armistice was signed - "Received Promotion
as Captain in the Field - & The Military Cross for Peronne
when he led his Company through heavy Artillery & Machine Gun
fire, almost to Peronne Ramparts, where he established a

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a defensive position - at great personal risk, He went out to
locate the Hanks of the other Battalion, & successfully linked up with
them — This fact item from The London Gazette of Military
Crosses October 31st 1918 — He was also mentioned in dispatch
also received a very nice letter from Birchwood —

He gained his "Peter Russell Engineering Scholarship" - which
at the Tech - & was in his 3rd ^{year} at the varsity - where
he enlisted
