Dear Mr. Sodge

In answer to your Circular I append a short record of Hawley's movements since the war began, thinking it would be the best method of giving you the information you desire, he enlisted on Aug. 4th 1914, the morning on which war was declared and at once went into Camp as Medical Officer of the Battalion stationed at Larqs Bay.

When the 10th Infantry Battalion was formed he was appointed M. O. to that Bat. with the rank of Capt. and left with it for the Front on Oct. 20th, he was in Egypt and afterwards accompanied it to the Is. of Lemnos and was with the Landing Party on the morning of April 25th 1915 on Gallipoli.

He contracted Dysentery and Enteric and was sent away from Gallipoli on Oct. 1st to Alexandria, after recovering from two relapses he was sent back to Australia by the Thermopyles to recuperate.

He left by the Hospital Ship Karoola in May, after doing duty at Keswick Hospital for some weeks, was in Egypt a month and then went on to England, he has been doing duty at Salisbury Plains for some while, expecting to be sent to the Front any day.
