At No. 2 A.G.H., Wimereux, from 27th March, 1918, being R.M.O. 42nd Battn. from May to August, when transferred to No. 2 Australian Auxiliary Hospital, Southall, serving until demobilisation. Promoted major, 24th April, 1917. Awarded M.C.* and Mentioned in Despatches.
