With reference to your communication of the 4th inst on the abovementioned subject I have to inform you that my son Mr. H. R. G. Colman is at present at Salisbury Plain.

He was wounded by shrapnel on the face.

He was at the time in Belgium.

His rank is that of private.

His face has not been badly marked as stated above he is now at Salisbury

Plain, he having resumed duty.

Regarding "any further particulars" that will be of interest I may add that it was about midnight when he was wounded. He was on a machine gun at the time. After being wounded he had to make his way over ground that was being shelled by the enemy.

While crossing that ground an explosion
occurred by the side of him. His coat tail
was blown away, he was knocked down &
directly he got up, something that had been
blown into the air by the explosion; in falling,
knocked his helmet off. In a minute
or two after that he was in safe ground.
