

Lieut. E. L. Medlyn attached to the Headquarters Coy. of the 20th. Aust. Army Service Corps enlisted for Active Service abroad on May 26th. 1915.

After several weeks training at Mitchem he proceeded to the inevitable sands of Egypt as Sergeant, and then to Gallipoli where he spent several weeks immediately prior to the Evacuation. On returning to Egypt he was despatched with the Headquarters Coy. to France, where he has since gained a double promotion, and now holds the rank of First Lieutenant.

In recent letters to hand he reports that he is still enjoying excellent health, and has thus far escaped wounds and sickness, although recently engaged in a very exposed and dangerous position in charge of the water supply near the front line. Lieut. Medlyn is now in Belgium and his latest letters were written 30 ft. Down in a "one-time" German (now British) dug-out.
