Enlisting in A.A.M.C. 1st May, 1917, and sailing in July, was at Salisbury Plain for two months as M.O., No. I Dermatological Hospital, and then for seven months on Board work at Weymouth. Lent to 51st (Scottish) Division with five other Australian M.O.'s, was with Highland Field Ambulance in Bethune sector at Epernay from 8th April, 1918, to 1st September. Joining 14th A.F.Amb. 3rd October, became R.M.O. 54th Battn., 13th and 14th Field Artillery Brigades and returned in July, 1920, after six months' non-military employment.
