At a meeting of the Senate of the University, held yesterday, Dr. William S. Dawson, of Maudaley Mental Hospital, Denmark Hill, London, was appointed to the Professorship of Psychiatry, rendered vacant by the retirement of Sir John Macpherson. The new Professor is a graduate of the University of Oxford, holding the degrees of B.A., M.B., Ch.B., M.D. (Oxon.), as well as a diploma in Psychological Medicine of the University of London. He is also a member of the Royal College of Physicians, London, and served for a period of three years in the Great War. Dr. Dawson is at present Senior Assistant at Maudaley Hospital, London, and is lecturer in clinical psychiatry in the University of London, since he has been engaged in teaching students, graduates, and médical officers of mental hospitals. He has had an extensive experience im-early cause of mental disorder, and has written many papers bearing on psychiatry. He recently spent is months in the United States as Rocke-feller Research Fellow, studying the psychiatric training and the organisation of social workers, but principally engaged in research in clinical psychiatry under Professor Heyer at the Phipps Psychiatric Institute, Johns Hopkins Hospital, Raltimore, where he also acted as instructor in medical psychology.
