Full details and remarks as to service:—
 Embarked as 2nd Lieut. Posted to 30th Battalion May 5th 1916. Service in Egypt 1 month. Transferred to France with 5th Division June '16. Joined the Light Trench Mortar Battery, 8th Brigade, June 20th. Soon afterwards entered trenches at Bois Grenier. A fortnight later transferred to Fleurbain sector. Took part in Fleurbain battle July 19, 1916. In October transferred to Humentieres sector, thence to Le Somme. Promoted to rank of Captain and O.C. of the battery Nov. 11, 1916. Mentioned in Sir D. Baird's Despatches January 1917. Awarded M.C. June 1917. Polygon Wood battle. Sept. 26 1917. Meschendale Oct. 1917.
