In reply to your Circular dated the 4th instant, asking for information in respect to Dr. E.A.H. Russell, the following particulars are furnished:-

Dr. E.A.H. Russell entered the Service in 1912.

At the outbreak of War in 1914 he was appointed Senior Medical Officer, Oaklands Camp; also Mitcham Camp.

Was granted a Commission in the A.I.F. in May 1915.

Served as Captain in the 3rd Australian General Hospital on Lemnos.

Has been promoted to rank of Major abroad and is now Second in Command of No. 6 Field Ambulance, of which Unit he has held, from time to time, the temporary Command.

He is with his Unit in Belgium, and was present at Pozieres and the Somme fights.
