Captain John C. Wells.

Captain J. C. Wells joined the A. I. F. shortly after war was declared

He spent some months in camp here and left for Egypt by the troopship Tera on Feb 4th 1915.

On arriving in Egypt he was attached to the staff of the 1st Australian General Hospital at Helwan.

At the commencement of the Palestine campaign he received the appointment of medical officer to the 1st Light Horse Regiment which he accompanied to Gallipoli.

Dr. Wells spent 8 or 9 months at Gallipoli where he was once slightly wounded but he did not leave the trenches.

He stayed at Gallipoli with his regiment until the evacuation

Since Dec 1915 Captain J. C. Wells
has been in the Egyptian desert
with the 1st Light Horse Regiment.
The hardships & privations have
been great & the heat intense &
there have been many dangerous
encounters with the Turks but
he has stuck to his post without
complaint & has done excellent
work for the wounded.
