Dear Sir,

Acting on the advice of General Sir John Cowans in England and Major W.S. Hanson of Adelaide, I am leaving Adelaide on 29th inst. by the R.M.S. Malwa for England to join the English Field Artillery. I am at present attached to the 34th Battery Australian Field Artillery in Adelaide and am advised that no more artillery will be sent from the Commonwealth to the front except in the shape of reinforcements to the units already there.

Major Hanson who is in command of the 34th Battery strongly advises me to go to England where I am led to believe a commission in the Field Artillery will be granted me.

I am at present engaged on the last three subjects for my L.L.B degree, and have only one subject left (viz. the Law of Evidence and Procedure) to complete my Final Certificate. I am desirous of obtaining a special examination in the above subject (Evidence and Procedure) in order to enable me to complete my final Certificate

I intend making an application to the Supreme Court for an order that the time spent by me in travelling to England and serving at the war shall be counted as service under articles. If I pass the examination in Evidence and Procedure (supposing a special examination is granted to me) for my final Certificate, I intend to make

an application to be admitted as a practitioner of the Supreme Court forthwith.

At the termination of the war it is my intention to remain in London and study for 12 months at the Inner Temple, and it will materially assist me if I have the standing of a Solicitor of this State. After admission to the Bar in England it is my intention to return to South Australia.

Consequently I hereby make application for a special examination in the Law of Evidence and Procedure on or before Thursday 22nd of this month. for the reasons above stated. Mr Poole who has acted as additional examiner in this subject informs me that he will be glad if appointed to act in that capacity without honorarium.

Will you be kind enough to lay this matter at the earliest possible opportunity before the Council and to advise the Faculty of Law and myself as soon as the Council has come to a decision.
