Enlisting 1st March, 1916, and sailing on the 16th, was with 4th Australian Field Ambulance in Egypt from 22nd April, and crossing with it to France, was at Pozières, Bullecourt, Messines, Ypres, Hébuterne and elsewhere until 24th May, 1918. Then transferring to No. 1 Australian General Hospital, Rouen, served until demobilisation. Promoted major, 7th April, 1917. Awarded D.S.O.* and Mentioned in Despatches.
