Then was with 7th Australian Field Ambulance, as R.M.O. 25th Battn. in October and November, and of 27th from 19th November until after the Armistice, being in the Messines sector during the winter of 1917–18 and then on the Somme from Corbie to Montbrehain. Returned in January, 1920, after three months' non-military employment. Awarded M.C.* and Mentioned in Despatches.
