Full details and remarks as to service:—

I Enlisted at the age of 18 soon after leaving school. Went to France in December 1916. Was in action at Fleury in same month with 11th Battery as a driver, transferred to a Gunner in February 1917 at La Baille, remained as a gunner till the taking of Bapaume. then joined signallers attached to the 11th Battery, while in action at Bullercourt was attached for signal duty to the 11th Battalion and was awarded the Military Medal. I remained as a signaller throughout the campaigning in France & Belgium and was wounded at Mont St Quentin on 2/9/18 while attached for duty to 24th Battalion returned to unit 30/9/18 and remained with them till the end of the war.
