TAYLOR, MILDRED BEVINGTON: *b.* 24 Nov. 1880, at Manchester; *dau.* of James Medland Taylor, architect, and Priscilla Coventry; *yr. sister* of M. E. J. Taylor (*q.v.*); *er. sister* of A. P. Taylor (Mrs Allworthy) (*q.v.*). *Educ.* Manchester H. Sch.; Girton 1900-04; Pfeiffer Scholar; Class. Trip., Pt I, Cl. II, div. 1, 1903; Pt II, Cl. II, 1904; St Mary's Tr. Coll., Paddington. Class. M., Cheltenham Ladies' Coll.; Blackheath H. Sch. Gave up teaching for social work with Mrs Higgs (M. Kingsland) (*q.v.*), chiefly concerning women's hostels and lodging houses; took cottage in Yorks for working-girls' holidays; joined small company of women in community called the 'Fellowship of the Heavenly Way' and worked for 4 or 5 years until her death among 'outcastes' in India at small mission station at Pakbara, Moradabad, United Provinces. *Died* 1924.*

Member Ripon Bd. of Guardians for 6 years; Member of Ripon and Pateley Bridge R.D.C. since 1945. Some time after marriage she and her husband became Tertiaries of the Dominican Order, and she assumed name of Catherine; after husband's death became Superior of Chapter of Dominican Tertiaries; all its members imprisoned by Bolsheviks in Boutirsky Prison, Moscow, where Mrs Abrikosoff died after great suffering.
