Conferring of Degrees.

IMPOSING CEREMONY.

One of the most important ceremonies in the Sydney University commemoration—the conferring of degrees-took place in the Great Hall of the University yesterday, in the presence of a large number of parents and friends of graduates and students. The Great Hall could not accommodate all those who desired to be present. The Chancellor (Sir William Cullen) presided, and he was supvorted by the Vice-Chancellor (Dr. Cecil Purser), the Warden and Registrar, and the Acting Warden, members of the University Senate, the chairman of the Professorial Board, and the Deans of the Faculties represented on the senate. There were also on the dais the professors, associate and assistant professors, the Acting Registrar, heads of the colleges, heads of departments, and other members of the teaching staff, as well as the graduates who had secured degrees.

His Excellency the Governor and Lady de Chair were received by the Chancellor, and conducted to seats on the dais. The Lord Mayor (Alderman Gilpin) and Sir Arthur Rick-ard also occupied seats near the Chancellor. There was the usual procession from the senate room to the Great Hall, and the brilliant robes of the various officials gave a touch of colour that increased the impressive-

ness of the ceremony.

There were the usual cheering and clapping as the various students came forward, but this was more noticeable when Mr. Herbert Vere Evatt. M.A., was introduced to the Chancellor to have the degree of Doctor of Laws conferred. There were similar pro-longed outbursts of cheering when Professor John Irvine Hunter was introduced to receive his degree of Doctor of Medicine, and when Mr. John J. C. Bradfield received his degree of Doctor of Science in Engineering. Projessor Sir Henry Barraclough, the Acting Dean of the Faculty of Engineering, in introducing Mr. Bradfield to the Chancellor, said that the object of the senate in granting the degree of Doctor of Science in Engineering was not to encourage excellence in ordinary engineering work, but to kindle enthusiasm in research in engineering. The examination which Dr. Bradfield had passed had been set by Sir John Monash (Vice-Chancellor of the Melbourne University), Professor Chapman (of the Ade-lated University), and Professor Warren (of the Sydney University). Dr. Bradfield had been awarded the University medal as well as gaining his degree. Dr. Bradfield had been one of the earliest graduates in engineering in the Sydney University, 40 years ago, and to-day he was associated with the governing body of the University. Dr. Bradfield had apent the whole of his life in engineering work in this State. To-day he was engaged on the most important undertaking in his life. and one of the greatest undertakings in world—the Sydney Harbour bridge—which, when completed, would contain the greatest arch ever erected by the hand of man. (Cheers.) Dr. Bradfield was specially congratulated by the Chancellor.

In the course of his address, the Chancellor

In the course of his address, the Chancellor said that the commemoration this year was being associated with the war memorial which the University was arranging to establish in the University was arranging to establish in memory of those who served in the war, and of those who served and did not return to them. He was most pleased to offer a hearty welcome to his Excellency the Governor and Lady de Chair. (Applause.) While they welcomed criticism, it was one of the greatest consolations to him to know that the people of this State had shown the most perfect condence and trust in the service of the University. Your in and year out they had reversity. Year in and year out they had re-ceived private benefactions, and they offered their sincere congratulations to these good people, however small their confidence in the University might have been. There were two instances last year that deserved special men-tion. The first was the Denison Miller Scholarship, supplied by a fund of £1500 through a committee of which Bir Arthur Rickard was chairman, and to whom a great deal of the success of the fund was due. The other gift success of the fund was due. The other gift was that of £1000 by Mr. G. H. Bosch for re-search work in the department of anatomy. It showed their confidence and the high esteem in which the University was held to-day. They knew that whenever he got the chance he always spoke of Australian patriotism and the pride they had in their own country. When they saw so many young people entering that corporation as accredited members they had no fear of what the future might be. Yet they asked what kind of contributions were the seats of learning making to the patriotism and pride of the country. They claimed no special fitness to equip these young people in their task of life. No word had ever been heard nor had any suggestion ever been made to them as to what occupation they should follow. Nothing bad ever been heard in the University by any young man or woman that one work was more honourably than another. They prided themselves with the thought that the work done by the University was one of the greatest adventages the State possessed. What could higher education do for the community? It helped that community to keep a level mind—never to lose its head. When he spoke of a level mind be did not forget that they tried to level mind he did not forget that they tried to stimulate the energies of students, and he felt that they need never fear for the Australians energies. He was proud that the people had such faith in the University, that they be-lieved in the principles inculcated by the University, and that they showed confidence in it by continuing to help its progress. From a very small growth they had reached a pro-fessorial staff of 40 and a lecturing staff of something over 240. From the earliest days of Professor Woolley and Dr. Badham the high standard of patriotic duty had never falled. It was still, and always would be, maintained in the University. If the public thought that by bringing their sons and daughters to the University they would be better fitted for the walk of life, they would give them of their best. They cared nothing for comments as to whether this or that subject should be taught, or whether this or that one was neglected. Whatever the people believed they should adopt would be adopted if they gave them the means to pay for it. They did their best to fit the man and woman for the world; no one could do more. (Applause.)

His Excellency the Governor said he had heard before he arrived in Australia about the fame of the Sydney University. But he was not prepared to find such a fine institution, such a fine building, and such numbers of undergraduates and students here. He thought the rising generation and the present young generation of New South Wales were indeed fortunate in having such a splendid University in this State. He knew of the splendid scientific appliances, and he knew of

University in this State. He knew of the splendid scientific appliances, and he knew of the high moral tone in the University, as well the high moral tone in the University, as well as the high sense of chivairy, patriotism, and loyalty. He knew, too, that the Sydney University stood high amongst the universities of the world. When he had seen all the young women and men that day on whom degrees had been conferred it reminded him that he, too, had had the honorary degree of LL.D. conferred on him by the McGill University, Montreal. At the same time similar degrees were conferred on Lord Halfour and Sir Tom Bridges, the present Governor of South Australia. Those degrees were conferred during the war. Though they were not so well ing the war. Though they were not so well entitled to the degree as those who had won their degrees, he thought he was speaking for Lord Balfour and Sir Tom Bridges when he said that they were very proud of them. As the official visitor to the University, he con-gratulated the Chancellor, Vice-Chancellor, Senate, and staff, and intimated that he would often visit the University, both in his official and unofficial capacity.
