The Granville Council has appointed Mr. W. G. Moffitt town clerk. Mr. Moffitt is at present deputy town clerk and accountant at Parramatta.

Brevet-Colonel (Hon. Brigadier-General) J. M. Antill, C.B., C.M.G., has been mobilised as officer commanding at Menangle camp as from January 9.

Captain Guy Ardlaw Lawrance, A.A.M.C., who relinquished the position of resident medical officer to the Royal North Shore Hospital, North Sydney, on his appointment to the Australian Imperial Forces in August, 1916, and has since been on active service in France, has been awarded the Military Cross.

Private Harold Douglas Markham-Landers, reported missing some months ago, is now officially stated to have been killed at Bullecourt. The eldest son of Sergt. Landers, of Smithfield Police Station, he was 20 years of age, and prior to enlisting was a fitter at Eveleigh workshops.

Constable Charles Leek has retired from the police after nearly 36 years service. For the past five years he has been doing escort work at the Government Savings Bank in Moore-street. Prior to joining the service he was for five years in the Permanent Artillery.

One of Queensland's best-known journalists and soldiers, Colonel (Brigadier) Spencer Browne, called at Victoria Barracks this morning. He returned to Australia a few days ago, after two years active service, and is to leave Sydney for Brisbane at the end of next week. Colonel Browne has served in high positions in Egypt, Gallipoli, and elsewhere abroad. When he enlisted he was editor of the Brisbane "Observer."
