Enlisting in January, 1915, and sailing with 5th Reinforcements, 13th April, joined 2nd Battn. at Gallipoli as second-lieutenant 10th June. Commanded platoon at Lone Pine and A Cov. during the Evacuation, taking charge of C party (the last to leave). Transferring to 54th Battn. on formation, took part in the Desert March. Tel-el-Kebir to Moascar. Commanded A Cov. at Fromelles in July. 1916, 14th Brigade raiding party at Fleurbaix in August and A Cov. on the Somme 1916-17, being wounded at Bullecourt 15th May, 1917. while repulsing Prussian Guard attack. Returned to Australia 14th November. Promoted lieutenant, 7th August, 1915; captain, April, 1916; major, 24th April, 1917. Decorated D.S.O.\* by H.M. the King at Aldershot 27th July, 1917, for gallantry at Bullecourt. Mentioned in Despatches.

Early education at Rosetta Academy, Belfast. Later at Adelaide School of Mines.
