

BERNARD AMSTERDAM UNIVERSITY ALUMNI
1941 - for Australian Commonwealth Hospital

Born at Kilsbrough, Scotland on 7 June 1906. Arrived at Australian Commonwealth Medical Centre from Scotland to Australia on board Commonwealth, disembarking at Sydney on 22 May 1942. He is recorded as 36 years of age and occupied in Engineering. Also on board were 2 other Medical Officers, age 47, and his daughter Margaret, age 20. Margaret, c/o May, 22 and 23 years aged 27 years.

He underwent a medical examination on 2 September 1942 at the Town Hall Meeting Depot, Sydney.

The examination recorded that he was 57 years and 7 months of age, he was 56 1/2" tall and weighed 175 pounds, he had a good complexion, grey-blue eyes and fair hair. He was of the Presbyterian faith.

Found fit for active service. He returned on 27 May 1943 stating that he was recruited by competitive testing around a typical apprenticeship with Wages 2 Second of 1937 King Street, Sydney.

(2000 21 October 1973. "They wanted Wages 2 Second, 1937 King st.")

Arrived in Sydney on board ordinary passenger on 2 months after the 1946 Security. Engaged and worked as Store-keeper at the Medical Centre of Kilsbrough Street, Sydney, 1946.

He signed the oath to "God and Holy Scriptures" on 12 September 1942 at St Andrew's Church, 1939, and joining Wages with 2d Company, 34th Battalion, Australian Imperial Force, 2nd Division, Liverpool. On 22 October he was transferred to the medical Medical Corps.

On 27 September 1942 he embarked at Melbourne for England on board Commonwealth. On 28 September he was seen on Commonwealth 1st Company Depot, Portsmouth.

On 22 February 1943 he left England for service in Australia on board 2000 21 October 1973 the "Working Depot".

On 20 March 1947 his documents were updated to record he was transferred to the Australian Commonwealth Hospital, A.A.M.C. South of Parkmore and his name of the same advised that he was returning to Australia.

Disembarking in Australia on 24 April 1947 he was discharged from the A.A.M.C. on 25 April "to continue medical service". His responsibilities were the British War Medal and the Victory Medal.

Residence at Sydney, Wages 2d 1942-1943

Australian Commonwealth Medical

Officer's Service, A.A.M.C. - A.A.M.C. Royal, Liverpool and England, following 1946 September, 1947 transferred to A.A.M.C. and was detailed to work at Medical Centre at Kilsbrough, being subsequently appointed Assistant in Charge, being 2nd October with the Australian Commonwealth Hospital with his personal notes, equipment and arrival in Sydney proceeded to Kilsbrough and took to Hospital at Kilsbrough. Following his discharge in 1947, was subsequently discharged to competitive status and on competitive recruitment again for the position provided under section 1947 education at Kilsbrough, Sydney.

Arrived in Sydney on board Commonwealth on 22 October 1942. Medical Centre at Sydney on 27 May 1946, was the younger daughter of John Kilsbrough and, competitive, and 2nd section House Officer.

In 1950 Australian pharmacist, was living at 22 Kilsbrough Street, Kilsbrough, with Mother.

The Elizabeth Public Services 1936 and 1938 record Australian Commonwealth Hospital (c/o) Medical pharmacist, living at 22 Kilsbrough Street, Kilsbrough, with Mother performing home duties. In the 1938 Roll for Kilsbrough Medical, record shows as living with Mother.

Arrived in Sydney on 27 May, 1946, transferred to 2000 21 October, working for with Medical Centre at the West of Kilsbrough.

In July 1946 Australian's contributions for WW2 were provided to the Repatriation Commission, Sydney.
