M.C., Eng. II: Captain, 56th Battn., A.I.F., Gallipoli and France.

Enlisting in May, 1915, and sailing with 12th A.L.H. Regt. 11th June, was commissioned and transferred to 4th Battn. 8th December and to 56th in February, 1916, taking part in the "Desert March". Crossing to France 29th June, fought at Fromelles, Somme, Flers, Gueudecourt and elsewhere till wounded at Louveral 2nd April, 1917. On return from hospital in England served at Polygon Wood, Westhoek, Broodeseinde Ridge, Messines, Villers-Bretonneux, the Grand Offensive of Fourth Army, Proyart, Péronne, where wounded 2nd September, 1918, and till demobilisation, returning as Adjutant, troopship "Lancashire". Promoted lieutenant, 10th March, 1916, and captain "On the Field", 6th June. Awarded M.C.\* and Mentioned in Despatches.

Educated at Greenwich Public and Fort St. High Schools. Later at Sydney Technical College.
