Dr. Archibald W. G. Murray, whose death occurred last Friday as the result of a motor accident at Colac (Vic.), was well known throughout the western district of Victoria. For three successive years he was president of the Colac Golf Club. Dr. Murray, who was 44 years of age, was born in Sydney and

graduated at Sydney University.

In the Great War, Dr. Murray was an officer in the R.A.M.C., and saw active service in the Imperial 29th Division on Gallipoli. Subsequently he was invalided home to the Gene-Hospital, Camberwell, London. ral recovery, he joined the East Kent Regiment (The Buffs) in France. Returning later to England, he was appointed chief medical - superintendent for East Anglia, with heade quarters at Norwich. Shortly after returning t to Australia, Dr. Murray married Miss Gordon, youngest daughter of the late Mr. Gordon, of De Kerrileau Station, on the Murray River. Mrs. Murray and two young sons survive him.

Mr. and Mrs. C. T. W. Murray, of Manly, are his parents, and two sisters are Mrs. Graeme Watson, of Wellington (N.Z.), and Miss Cora Murray, of Manly. Dr. C. Templeton Murray, D.D.S., of Manly, is his only sur-

viving brother.
