Ellie Maude Curnow. Obiit. July 18, 1930.

Miss Curnow by will bequeathed to the College half the residue of her estate, for the foundation of a scholarship in memory of her mother.

Miss Curnow was the daughter of the Rev. W. Curnow, of the Methodist Ministry. He was a man of scholarship and literary ability, and was at one time Editor of the *Sydney Morning Herald*.

Mrs. Curnow took an active and keen interest in the foundation of the Women's College, being a member of the first Ladies' Collecting Committee, and organizing tableaux and an excursion in aid of the first £5,000 necessary to make the Act of Parliament effective. Her husband was a member of the first General Committee, and her son one of the early subscribers.

Miss Curnow herself was always interested in the College, as is shown by her desire to perpetuate her mother's name in
