Dear Sir,

In regard to your enquiry regarding Messrs K.B.Goode and R.B.Goode, their father is at present in England but I am only too glad to give you whatever information I can regarding these lads.

Mr. K.B.Goode was wounded rather severely at Gallipoli and after some months was discharged in England from the A.I.F. as being unfit for further service. He stayed on in England and had just obtained a position with an engineering firm when he was conscripted by the British Authorities for the British Army, though he had not by any means recovered from the injuries he received at Gallipoli. His father, however, was able to get the authorities to allow him to enlist voluntarily, which he did, and he is now studying for a commission in the Artillery at, I think, Sandhurst.

Mr. R.B.Goode went away from here with the very first contingent that left Australia, serving in the A.S.C.. He went right through the Gallipoli campaign and since, and up to date, has been serving in France. He has not, fortunately, been wounded at all, but all the holiday he has had since he left Australia, has been for a period of five days which he recently had with his parents


