Sapper R. W. A. Coy, only son of Mr + Mrs
A. G. H. Coy of Angus Home Parafield
Nr Salisbury enlisted in the Engineers
in August 1915. At the end of January
he left for Sydney and spent 2 months
training there. He sailed from Sydney
on the 21st March and landed at Tel-el-
Kebir. After spending 6 wks at this place
he re-embarked for France. He was in
the great battle at Pozieres. He was buried
twice by debris from shell and had to
be dug out but escaped injury although
badly bruised. In a letter sent to his
parents he stated that his corps was
delighted after hearing of what they had
accomplished. Later news received states
that he is in splendid health and was on
the move again. He was 21 years of age
on the 9th of October
