M.B.: Captain, A.A.M.C., A.N. and M.E.F., New Guinea. Enlisting 4th August, 1914, served at the Landing at Kaba Kaul with a detachment from the Naval Reserve 11th September. Taking off his Red Cross brassard to protect a wounded prisoner and escort, went, despite warnings, to tend another wounded man without it and while doing so was fired upon.

Killed in Action, Kaba Kaul, 11th September, 1914—the first Australian officer to fall in the Great War.

Early education at Sydney Church of England Grammar School. Later at St. Paul's College.
