4th inst, Dr. W. J. Close enlisted towards
the end of 1914, I think in November,
was in camp for about eight months,
leaving with the 4th L. Horse F. A. in
June 1915, which was sent to Egypt,
where he spent a year principally in
the desert. He left for France about
July last, and has been doing work
as Dr. M. C. near the trenches, for over
two months, besides attending to the
sick & wounded, he has tried to improve
the sanitary conditions, & has devoted
special attention to baths for the
soldiers, hot baths have been instituted
about 400 or 500 yards from firing
lines when necessary the soldiers are
supplied with clean clothing after
bath - He has had no serious illness

and has not been wounded.
